


Public Safety: Fire Department Report

- FF. Dusty Clements won the People's Choice Award at the Main Street Chili Cook-off.




2023 4th Quarter Activities (continued):

Police Department Activities

- Held 2 car seat inspection training and teaching events
- Participated in Safety Day at the Caterpillar House
- Assisted with the Empower 4 Life fund raising golf tournament
- Participated in the Elite Youth Group mentor meeting
- Officers participated in the Coweta Correction fund raising softball tournament
- Joined in Central Baptist Church's Hero Day
- 4th Quarter classes taught by the Newnan Police Department Training Division include Accident Avoidance, Taser Training, Firearms Requalification, Surviving the Ground Fight, Advanced SWAT, and Stop Stick



- Teen Programs: Teen Open Art.






**General Fund

General Fund Revenue Receipts by Classification







State Pool Investments 4th Qtr Account Balances

Bank Account Investments 3rd Quarter Account Balances




